

## Final Project: A Complete Portfolio Website

### **Objective:**

You've designed the look for your web page in Photoshop, and you've converted that into a single, working web page. Now you're ready to complete your portfolio website by creating all of the pages for it, building a working menu between your pages, adding the necessary text, and coming up with a way to showcase your images in a gallery page.

### **What you will do:**

- 1) Use your single-page design for your site to create the rest of your pages (use "Save As" to keep this existing structure and styles, and then change out the content.
- 2) Make sure that all of your styles are kept to your external CSS document, so that the look of your site remains consistent from page to page.
- 3) Change out the page title, meta description/keywords, and menu links so that they are appropriate to each individual page..
- 4) Add an image gallery of some sort – multi-page gallery?, single-page "swap image" gallery?, LightBox gallery?
- 5) Build at least 5 pages for your completed site – I recommend an About page, a Gallery page, a Contact page. Other possible pages: a Home page (if you want to have some sort of introduction different than your About page), a Résumé page, an Artist's Statement page, a Links page (if your work is shown in other places, too, or to connect your site to those of your friends/family/colleagues), and perhaps multiple gallery pages if you want your work separated into different groups.

### **Requirements:**

- At least 5 pages, all connected through a consistent menu.
- External CSS sheet linked to each page, providing a consistent look to the whole site.
- Appropriate Titles and Meta Descriptions/Keywords for each page.
- Some sort of Gallery page(s) with at least 9 images.

### **What to turn in:**

- Upload your completed site to your Pixelweavers account, along with all necessary "dependent files" (images, javascripts, css, etc.). As always, check to make sure *everything* works on the live site: links, images, roll-overs, slideshows, etc.

**Grading rubric:**
